Guide dogs replace the eyes of their handler, so they have a responsibility to make a decision on how to direct the handler to a specific destination and to protect the handler from potential risks.



Year Six's trip to Liverpool

On Tuesday, the class visited Liverpool Maritime Museum. We undertook this visit so that we could look at the Titanic exhibition that is housed there due to the company that owned the Titanic coming from Liverpool.

World Book Day

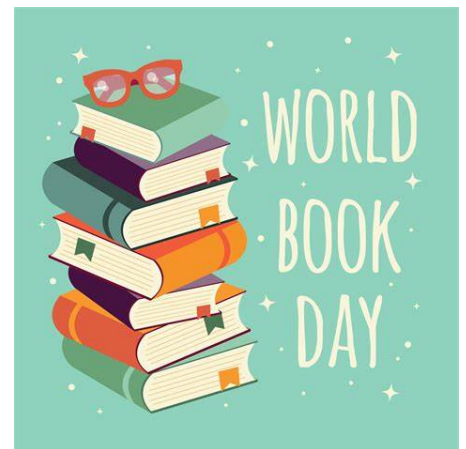
