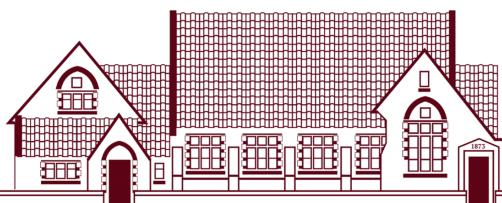

On Tuesday 21st April, nine of our passionate Year 6 children agreed to represent our school at the 3rd Walsall Youth Debate.

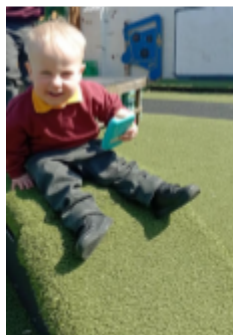
The focus of this debate was close to our hearts at Leamore, focusing on waste management and on moving towards Walsall [Net Zero 2041 Strategy](#) [click the link].
